Staff and Leadership Programs

Summer 2023 Age Eligibility

*Updated 09/01/2022

STAFF

Applicant must either:

- Be at least 17 years old by June 25, 2023 (regardless of grade) or
- Be at least 17 years old by December 1, 2023 and be in the graduating class of 2024
 - \circ $\;$ This means a junior in high school for the 2022-2023 academic year $\;$
 - Anyone that meets this age requirement and completed LIT summer 2022, can apply for both CIT and staff. (CIT decisions will be made before staffing decisions. If offered both CIT and staff spot, the CIT monies will be refunded in full.)

<u>Please Note</u>: Counselors **must** be 17 years old to be in an overnight cabin. Staff that are 16 years old are required to work on day camp or kitchen staff until they turn 17. Because of these limitations, it is more difficult for a 16-year-old applicant to be offered a staff position (especially if they are not turning 17 years old during the summer).

CIT

Applicant must either:

- Be at least 16 years old by June 25, 2023 (regardless of grade) or
- Be at least 16 years old by December 1, 2023 and be in the graduating class of 2025
 - 15-year-olds with late summer/fall birthdays should really consider applying LIT for 2023 due to future staff limitations mentioned below.

<u>Please Note</u>: CITs cannot be older than 17 years old during their CIT session.

A staff member can only work on day camp or kitchen staff until they turn 17. Because of these limitations, it is more difficult for 16-year-old staff applicants to be offered a position (especially if they are not turning 17 years old during the summer).

LIT

Applicant must either:

- Be at least 15 years old by June 25, 2023 (regardless of grade) or
- Be at least 15 years old by December 1, 2023 and in the graduating class of 2026
 - 14-year-olds with late summer/fall birthdays should really consider being a camper for 2023 due to future staff limitations mentioned below.

<u>Please Note</u>: LITs cannot be older than 16 years old during their LIT session.

15-year-olds can be both a camper and LIT as long as their camper week is before their LIT session. A staff member can only work on day camp or kitchen staff until they turn 17. Because of these limitations, it is more difficult for 16-year-old staff applicants to be offered a position (especially if they are not turning 17 years old during the summer).
